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SUPPLIES & TOOLS:

- DCWW®:
 - 12"x12" Cork Stack®
 - 6"x6" Stacks®: Burlap, Corrugated, Handmade, Woven
 - 12"x12" Sayings and Patterns Template
 - Geometric Circle Template
- White craft paint
- Twine/ribbon
- 2'x3' foam core sheet or mat board
- Shadow box frame
- Multiple sheets of black craft foam
- Paintbrush
- Hot glue gun & glue sticks, fabric adhesive, spray adhesive or double-stick tape, adhesive foam squares
- Scissors: Paper & fabric
- Craft knife
- Paper trimmer
- Pencil
- Ruler

DIRECTIONS:

1. Start by preparing the background. To do this, ensure that the base (foam core) measures 2'x3'. Draw a vertical line down the center of the board. Draw two more vertical lines down the board, one in the center of each half. This will divide the board into four 6"x3' sections. Using the spray adhesive, cover the board. With the lines as a guide, adhere burlap sheets down each 6" strip, ensuring that the board is completely covered. Smooth and press along the edges of each section to secure in place.
2. Using the chevron pattern in the Sayings and Patterns template, paint the chevron print onto each square as shown. Set aside to dry.
3. While the paint is drying, pull out the Geometric Circle template (total of 4 sheets). For the template pieces on the first page, use the Woven Stack® for the base pieces and the Corrugate Stack® for the top. For the template pieces on the next two pages, use the fiber paper in 2 colors as shown. For the template piece on the last page, adhere first to the craft foam and, after it is cut out, add sections of cork on top, cutting out holes with craft knife. Note: To have all the necessary pieces for each section, follow the directions on each template shape, using the same paper for all multiple cuts. Whether it needs 2 pieces of each or 18, be sure to cut all the multiples using the same color/material. When cutting out the elongated rectangles, write the number of each template piece (top right corner) on the back of the respective shape.
4. Once all the pieces are cut, begin adhering the coordinating sections together. Starting with the arrows, adhere the top pieces to the bottom ones, matching up the tail points and using adhesive foam squares to secure in place. Adhere the elongated rectangles together as shown using adhesive foam squares to secure in place. Use the numbers on the back of each piece to match up the corresponding shape. Adhere the center section to a coordinating circle base.
5. Start assembling the project by finding the center of the project. Adhere the large circle grouping in place, the center of the circle in the center of the display. Next, arrange both sets of arrows around the center circle until desired look is achieved and project arrangement is balanced. Adhere in place. Finish by adding the elongated rectangles to the display as shown.
6. Put finished artwork display in shadowbox frame. Display where desired.
