## woven parachute cord bracelet



### SUPPLIES & TOOLS:

- (1) 8' length of 550 or 325 parachute cord
- (1) 12mm or 15mm plastic buckle
- E-Z Jig Bracelet Maker
- Scissors
- PVA glue or butane lighter.
- Rule, tape measure or yard stick

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Set the Jig to the desired length using a ruler and the adjustment bolt and wing nut. Attach buckle halves to the appropriate side. Fold the cord to find the middle. Feed the middle down through the first buckle half and make a lark's head knot by passing the ends through the loop that was pushed down through the buckle. Repeat the process to double the lark's head knot filling the width of the buckle.
2. Bring the working ends across to the other buckle and feed the ends down through the buckle half.
3. Bring the working end around and back through the buckle to fill the buckle width.
4. Beginning with the left end, bring it over the left "inner" cord and under the right.
5. Bring the right working end over the right "inner" cord and under the left.
6. Repeat step 4.
7. Repeat step 5.
8. Continue until the weave reaches the desired length.
9. Turn bracelet over and bring both working ends through the loop on the left side. Pull the working ends tight and clip with sharp scissors. Finish by fusing the ends with a heat source (preferred) or using PVA glue (takes a few hours to cure).
