


## rain boot liners





### SUPPLIES & TOOLS:

- 1 yd ruffled fleece
- Thread
- Paper for pattern
- Sewing machine
- Scissors
- Pins
- Chalk marking pencil

### DIRECTIONS:


1. Follow Steps 2 through 4 to cut out the pieces.
2. Print out the template for the size boot desired. Compare the sole pattern to actual foot, making sure there is  $1/4$ " seam allowance around foot. Make any changes needed to the sole. Measure the edge of the sole along one side of the foot from the center front to the center back and add  $1/2$ " seam allowance. Compare this measurement to the edge of the foot pattern. Lengthen or shorten the pattern at the straight back edge.
3. Fold down the edge of the fleece without the ruffle evenly. Cut two foot pieces, placing the center front edge on the fold and two soles. Mark the center front and back of the sole. Mark the center front on both the top and bottom edges of the foot
4. Measure the circumference of calf about  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " above the top of the rain boot. Add 1" to this measurement for the width of the top. Draw a rectangle the width by about 13" along the ruffled edge of the fleece. Draw a line continuing the sides of the rectangle down through the ruffle. Cut out two tops in this manner.
5. Follow Steps 6 through 14 to make the rain boot liners.
6. The right side of the fabric, which is more velvet-like, will be on the inside against foot and then will fold down to be the outside of the ruffle. Stitch the back edge of the foot pieces together with the right sides together using a  $1/2$ " seam allowance.
7. Pin the foot to the sole with the wrong sides together matching the center front and back and make sure the edges fit together. If not, make an adjustment to the back seam.






8. Finger press the seam open and topstitch 1/4" from the seam. Trim the seam allowance close to the stitching.




9. With the wrong sides together, pin the foot back to the sole the same as before and stitch around the edge using a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn wrong side out.



10. Fold the tops in half lengthwise with right sides together. Stitch the edges together using a 1/2" seam allowance.




11. Finger press the seam open and topstitch 1/4" from the seam. To make this easier, start at the edge with the ruffle and stitch down to about 3" below the seam on both sides of the seam. Then, beginning at the bottom, topstitch the remainder of the seam allowances. Trim the seam allowance close to the stitching.




12. Right sides out, fold the ruffle down along the seam. Topstitch 1/4" from the edge.



13. Pin the top to the upper edge of the foot with the wrong side together again, matching the center front and the seams at the back. Stitch them together using 1/2" seam allowance.



14. Trim the seam allowance of the top to 1/4". Finger press the seam allowance of the shoe up toward the top. Topstitch 1/4" from the seam on the top.
