



tuscany wine charms or napkin rings

SUPPLIES & TOOLS: Makes four

- Forster[®] Woodsies[®] tags
- FolkArt® acrylic paints: Terra Cotta, Nutmeg, Hauser Green Light
- Paintbrushes

- Mod Podge® satin or gloss
- Beads: green, gold, metallic
- Stretch® Magic 1mm clear bead & jewelry cord
- Tuscany Signs fabric scraps
- Lightweight fusible web scraps
- Clear drying glue
- 7mm jump rings
- Iron
- Small sharp scissors

DIRECTIONS:

- Select signs from fabric scraps and iron fusible web piece to back of each selected sign, completely covering motif. Follow manufacturer's directions for fusible web.
- 2. Cut out prepared signs, trimming carefully. Remove paper backing.
- 3. Match each sign with a Woodsies® tag of appropriate shape and dimensions.
- 4. Paint each wooden tag, 1 side at a time and allow to dry completely before painting the other side. Two or more coats of paint may be needed. Allow to dry completely after each coat.
- 5. Adhere fabric signs to wooden tags using Mod Podge®, following manufacturer's directions. Allow to dry. Paint Mod Podge® on the tag, allowing to dry completely after each coat until desired finish is achieved.
- 6. String beads on elastic cord to measure 6". Use an overhand knot (see back of Stretch® Magic package) to tie into a ring. Put a drop of clear-drying glue on knot and allow to dry before trimming ends.
- 7. Use jump rings to attach wooden charms to beaded ring.
- 8. Slip one over the base of each wine glass, or use as napkin rings.
