FALL TABLE SETTING

NAPKIN TRAY

SUPPLIES:

- 1/2 yd V.I.P Cornucopia fabric
- 1/2 yd. Peltex Interfacing or Timtex
- 1 yd. HeatnBond iron-on adhesive
- Machine embroidery thread to coordinate
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Four 1/2" Tassels
- Sewing machine with zig zag stitch
- Iron and ironing board

DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut two pieces of fabric, one piece of Peltex and two pieces of HeatnBond 14"x14" each.
2. Following the manufacturers directions, iron one piece of HeatnBond to the wrong side of each piece of fabric.
3. After peeling the paper backing off, iron the wrong side of the fabric squares to each side of the Peltex.
4. Using a ruler draw a 13"x13" square on the fabric. Cut out.
5. Using a 4½ – 5mm width satin stitch and the embroidery thread on the bobbin and on top, stitch around the four sides of the fabric.
6. Lightly mark 2½" in on all four sides of the fabric and straight stitch on that line.
7. Press up on the stitch line.
8. Bring each corner piece together and stitch from the bottom to the top to form box. See illustration 1.
9. Stitch or glue a tassel to each corner.

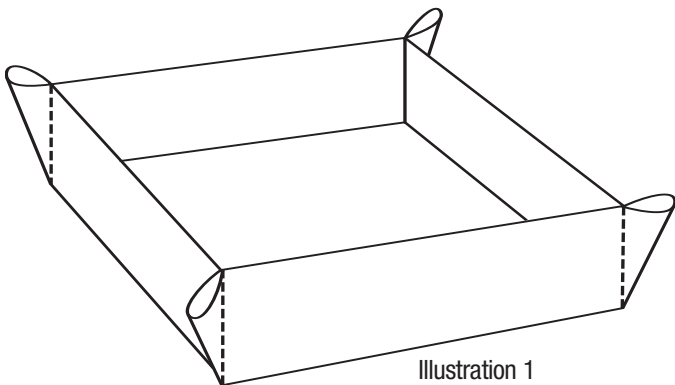

SILVERWARE CADDY

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SUPPLIES:

- 1/4 yd. V.I.P Gourds and Berries fabric
- 1/4 yd. Peltex
- 1/2 yd. HeatnBond
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Machine embroidery thread to coordinate
- One 1½" Tassel
- Glue gun and glue sticks
- Sewing machine with zig zag stitch
- Iron and ironing board

DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut two pieces of fabric, two pieces of HeatnBond and one piece of Peltex 9"x9".
2. Following the manufacturers directions, iron one piece of HeatnBond to the wrong side of each piece of fabric.
3. After peeling the paper backing off, iron the wrong side of the fabric squares to each side of the Peltex.
4. Using a ruler draw an 8"x8" square on the fabric. Cut out.
5. Using a 4½ – 5mm width satin stitch and the embroidery thread on the bobbin and on top, stitch around the four sides of the fabric.
6. Fold the square in half and stitch the side 4" up. Center the seam in the front and stitch across the bottom.
7. Fold back the flaps and glue down. Glue the tassel to the front.

Skill level: some sewing experience helpful.

60" TABLE RUNNER

SUPPLIES:

5/8 Yd. V.I.P Sunflower fabric
1 3/4 Yds. V.I.P Ombre Stripe fabric
Rotary cutter, ruler and mat
Sewing machine
Iron and ironing board
Basic sewing supplies

Note:

1/2" Seam allowances included in all pieces.
All measurements are given in width x length.

DIRECTIONS:

Cut:

- Three sunflower fabric 11"x18"
- Two stripe fabric 3"x11" center the motif – inner bands
- Two stripe fabric 3 1/2"x56" center the scroll – for the side bands of the runner
- Two stripe fabric 3 1/2" x 16" center the scroll – for the top and bottom bands of the runner
- One stripe 16"x61" back of runner

Sew:

1. With right sides together stitch the 11" sides of the fabric pieces to make stripes creating the body of the table runner. Sew in the following order: sunflower print, stripe, sunflower print, stripe and then sunflower print.
2. With right sides together stitch the 3 1/2"x56" stripe bands to the sides of the table runner.
3. Stitch the 3 1/2"x16" stripe bands to the top and bottom of the runner.
4. At all 4 corners of the table runner top and back, place a mark at 3" from corner along all edges. Draw a line connecting the marks, making a triangle at each point. Cut the fabric on the line to give shaping to the table runner.
5. With right sides together stitch the back and front of the table runner together leaving an opening for turning.
6. Turn, press and hand stitch the opening closed.

Skill level: No experience needed. 1 hour.

90" TABLERUNNER

SUPPLIES:

2 3/4 Yds. V.I.P Patchwork fabric
Ruler
Scissors
Pencil
Sewing machine
Basic sewing supplies
Ironing board and iron

Note: 1/2" Seam allowance included in all pieces

DIRECTIONS

1. Cut two pieces of fabric 16"x91" for the top and bottom of the table runner.
2. At all 4 corners of the table runner top and back, place a mark at 3" from corner along all edges. Draw a line connecting the marks, making a triangle at each point. Cut the fabric on the line to give shaping to the placemat.
3. With right sides together stitch the top and bottom of the table runner together leaving and opening for turning on one side.
4. Turn, press and hand stitch the opening closed.

Skill level: No experience needed. 1 hour.
