

**Skill level 1
Ribbon Roses**

Supplies:

- Double-faced satin ribbon in desired width and color
- Sewing needle; matching thread; scissors.

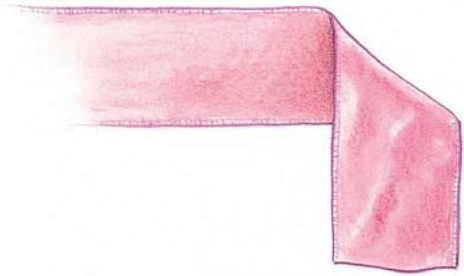
Note: To estimate ribbon yardage, you'll need 1 to 1-1/2 yds. of 1-1/2" ribbon for a large rose and 1/2 to 3/4 yd. of 7/8" ribbon for small roses.

Directions:

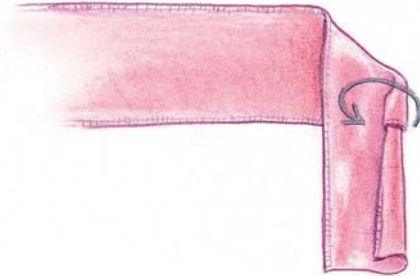
1. Fold ribbon end at a 45° angle, leaving 2" tail.
 2. Starting from outer edge, tightly roll fold inward to form "bud."
 3. Sew small stitch in bottom of roll to secure.
 4. Fold ribbon back at 45 degree angle then roll bud across ribbon (see arrow) until ribbon edge is straight again.
 5. Sew small stitch in bottom to secure. Repeat steps 4 and 5 as many times as desired, making a stitch after each fold-and-roll to secure ribbon.
 6. For last row, loosely wrap ribbon around rose, making tiny gathers in ribbon and stitching them to base.
- Trim ribbon to have a 1" end. Fold end 1/2" twice to underside of last row and stitch. When rose is desired size, tie off thread and stitch to desired surface.

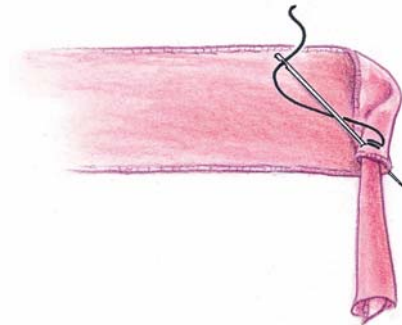
